
Background	1/4 yard - Riley White Solid	
Hedgie Body	Fat Eighth or 1/8th yard Enchanted Meadow Dots Songbird	
Hedgie Feet, Hands and Ears	8" x 8" square Enchanted Meadow Houndstooth Denim	
Hedgie Eyes and Nose	5" x 5" square Riley Black Solid	
Hedgie Heart and Inner Corners	10" x 10" square Enchanted Meadow Scattered Flowers Coral	
Hedgie Spikes and Corners	Fat Eighth or 1/8th yard Enchanted Meadow Main Denim	7
Border Print	1/4 yard - Mist Stardust Main Enchanted Meadow Main Songbird	
Pillow Back	1/2 yard Enchanted Meadow Dots Songbird	
Batting and Pillow Front Lining	Batting Piece - 24" x 24" - Pillow Front Lining - 24" x 24"	
Pillow Form	20" × 20"

Hedgie Block Assembly




Make 1 - Unfinished Quilt Block - 12 1/2" x 12 1/2"

Cutting:

Hedgie Body	A - 4 - 1 1/4" x 1 1/4" pieces B - 2 - 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" pieces C - 2 - 1 1/2" x 8 1/2" pieces D - 2 - 1 1/4" x 2 1/2" pieces E - 1 - 1 1/4" x 3" piece F - 2 - 1 1/4" x 4" pieces G - 1 - 1 3/4" x 8 1/2" pieces H - 2 - 1 1/4" x 1 3/4" pieces I - 2 - 2 1/2" x 3 1/4" pieces J - 2 - 1 3/4" x 2" pieces K - 1 - 1 1/2" x 1 3/4" piece
Hedgie Heart	L - 2 - 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" pieces
Hedgie Eyes and Nose	M - 2 - 1 1/4" x 1 1/4" pieces N - 1 - 1 1/4" x 1 1/2" piece
Hedgie Feet, Hands & Ears	O - 2 - 1 1/2" x 1 3/4" pieces P - 2 - 1 3/4" x 2 1/2" pieces Q - 2 - 2" x 2" pieces
Hedgie Spikes & Corners	R - 2 - 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" pieces S - 7 - 3" x 3" pieces
Background	T - 7 - 3" x 3" pieces U - 2 - 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" pieces

Assembly:

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the **A** print pieces. Place one on each of the top left corners of the two L pieces, right sides together, aligned as shown. Sew on the marked line, trim 1/4" away from the seam and press. Repeat with two more A print pieces on the top right corners of the L pieces.



Abbreviations: HST - Half Square Triangle WOF - Width of Fabric

All seam allowances are 1/4"

2. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the two B print squares. Place one on the bottom side of one of the L print squares, aligned as shown. Sew on the marked line, trim 1/4" away from the seam, and press. Repeat for the remaining B print piece and L piece, flipping the diagonal line so it is aligned as shown.



3. Sew the two units together down the center to form the heart block.



4. Sew the eye section by sewing together two D pieces, two M pieces and an E piece, in the following order as shown. D - M - E - M - D



5. Sew the nose section by sewing together the two F pieces and an N piece, in the following order as shown. F - N - F




6. Sew an H print piece to one side of an O print piece. Make two.



7. Sew an I print piece to the bottom side of the O/H unit. Make one as shown. Turn the second O/H unit 180 degrees, then sew the remaining I print piece to the bottom edge.



8. Sew the O/H/I units on the left and right sides of the heart unit.




9. Sew together the feet section by sewing together two J pieces, two P pieces, and a K piece, in the following order as shown. J - P - K - P - J



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Hedgie Block Assembly cont:


10. Assemble the body of the hedgehog as shown. Block measures 8 1/s" \times 10 1/2".




11. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the Q and R pieces. Place the Q pieces on the top left and right corners of the body unit, with the lines aligned as shown. Sew on the marked line and trim 1/4" away from the seam. Repeat with the R pieces on the bottom left and right corners, aligned as shown.




12. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the **T** background pieces. Place one, right sides together with a S print piece. Sew a 1/4" seam on the left and right sides of the marked line. Cut the unit apart on the marked line and press. Trim to 2 1/2' x 2 1/2". Make a total of 14 HST's (Half Square Triangle)



13. Sew together three HST sections as shown. Make sure the HST units are turned the correct way. Sew a U background square to the left and right sides of the top HST unit.




14. Sew the left HST unit to the left side of the hedgie body and the right HST unit to the right side of the body. Sew the top HST unit to the top side of the hedgie body. This section measures 12 1/2" x 12 1/2".




Borders Cutting:

Background	A - 2 - 2 1/2" x 12 1/2" B - 2 - 2 1/2' x 16 1/2"
Inner Corners	C - 4 - 2 1/2" x 2 1/2"
Print Borders	D - 2 - 2 1/2" x 16 1/2" E - 2 - 2 1/2" x 20 1/2"


15. Sew the A background pieces to the left and right sides of the Hedgie Block. Sew the B background pieces to the top and bottom sides of the Hedgie Block.



16. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the C print pieces. Place one on each corner, with the lines aligned as shown. Sew on the marked lines, trim 1/4" away from the seam, and press.



17. Sew the D print border pieces to the left and right sides of the block and the E print border pieces to the top and bottom sides of the block.




18. Using a Sachiko Machine, stitch around the hedgehog, 1/4" away from the seams. You can also do this with embroidery thread and a running stitch by hand.

19. Layer together the pillow front, batting and pillow front lining. Quilt as desired.


Pillow Back:



20. Hem one of the pillow back pieces by turning the bottom edge under 1/4" to the wrong side, then another 1/4". Sew just inside the folded edge. Repeat with the other pillow back piece, but hem the top edge.



21. Overlap the two back pieces so the piece hemmed at the bottom is on top of the piece hemmed at the top. Both should have right sides facing up, and they should overlap to form a 20 1/2" square. Baste along the sides where they overlap, 1/8" from the raw edge.



22 Place the pillow front right sides together with the pillow back. Sew around all four sides of the pillow. Clip each corner and turn right sides out. Press. 23. Place pillow form inside the pillow cover and adjust so the pillow form fits in evenly. Show off your cute new Harriett the Hedgie Pillow!
